artist spotlight: Jeff Tokarz

"Capturing the light and shadow of a subject with charcoal is the essence of an emotional story — a narrative filled with depth and authenticity."


Jeff Tokarz' work can be described as impressionist realism. Specializing in charcoal, he began painting and selling commissions in 2020. Self-taught, Tokarz paints portraits and landscapes that depict compelling narratives. Charcoal, he finds, intensifies observers' emotional connections with his paintings.

Inspired by Carl Bloch, Norman Rockwell, and John Singer Sargent,
Tokarz initiates the painting process collaboratively with clients seeking
to understand the story to be conveyed in the portrait, or landscape
commission. Working exclusively from reference photos, Tokarz painting




process begins with a 'blocking-in' of shapes and values to develop a composition. Final details and refinements, in concert with the client's wishes, continue until the narrative piece of art is approved.

Design Compelling Oil Paintings From Your Photos with Kevin Feary

March 9 & 16 | 10am - 4pm with 30 min. lunch break \$115 for one day workshop \$200 for two day workshop

Do you have a photo of a subject you've always wanted to paint, but aren't quite sure where to begin? During the winter months let's slow down, head to the studio and explore composition strategies using your photos. We will cover basic design to include, the initial simplification of abstract shapes, drawing, value structure and color; while painting the beautiful vistas from photos you've taken while on vacation. Or bring in any photos that you would like to paint from. I will demonstrate my methods and techniques for landscape painting to achieve a sense of reality, yet still see thick juicy paint on the surface. Individual instruction will be given as you work on your designs. Bring the oil supplies you're most comfortable using. As always, you can borrow any of mine. All skill levels welcome. Maximum 8 attendees per workshop day!

Gelli Plate Printmaking

Instructor: Jean Stephens

Gelli Plates are reusable printing plates that let you create monoprints without a press. In this **all day workshop** we will explore a variety of techniques unique to the Gelli plate to create decorative paper. We'll use stencils, create textures, explore wax resists and more.

You'll be encouraged to consider the importance of color and value while printing. This medium is fun and invites experimentation, expect plenty of time to play!

You'll need to bring to the workshop:

- a soft rubber brayer (Speedball 2.5"-3")
- a Gelli Arts printing plate (8" x 10")
- any special papers you'd like to print on.

Please bring a lunch and beverage of your choice and an apron.

The Mill will provide paint, basic paper, newsprint, paper towel and baby wipes.
