# Abstract Landscape Painting With Connie Ehindero Saturday, March 22, 2025 1-3pm

with an additional hour from 3-4pm for participants to paint on their own!

In this hands-on, two-hour workshop for Rochester Art Club members, we will explore ways to abstract the landscape in our painting practice. All levels are welcome.

Connie will demonstrate her thoughts and process and then you'll have time to find your own painting path. She'll discuss changes in how to see, feel, and think about landforms and land views. We'll do some composition and color experiments.

Bring some paper, 11"x14" or larger, and your favorite simple-to-set-up paint medium. You'll use your biggest brushes – 1" minimum. Bring two-three photographs—the bigger and more colorful the better. No finished paintings will be created during our time together, but instead we'll create abstracted studies of your photos to practice this new way of interpreting the landscape.



# artist spotlight: Scott Nost

# "Plein air season is almost here, my friends... I hope to see you out there!"

As a newbie plein air painter, I chose oil paint as my preferred medium for one simple reason: the built-in excuse that comes from never having used it before. For me, oils seemed like the "least bad" option for taking the studio out into the wild and unpredictable great outdoors for my first time.

All those years ago and I can still recall the entire session. My very first attempt at oil painting on location was just one disaster after another all afternoon long. But just 12.7 minutes into it, I was hooked! I've been on a decades-long plein air painting adventure ever since.

Today I'm an active member of the Genesee Valley (GVPAP), Greater Rochester (GRPAP), and Off-Color Painters (OCP) plein air painting groups and participate in several plein air events and competitions throughout the year. I've been lucky enough to be juried into, and won awards at several shows and events. I have also been rejected from many others.

I'm enjoying the opportunity to share what I do with artists and art clubs around the region through demos, classes and speaking engagements. As a self-taught artist, it feels good to be in a position to give a little back.

#### **Pastel Workshop with Dawn Emerson**

**Day 1:** focuses on additive and subtractive approaches with PanPastels, charcoal and pastels

Day 2: adds wet mixed media using a brayer

Day 3: can incorporate printing monotype and transfers

Interested in Figure Drawing? Flower City Figure Study is a fun and friendly drawing group that meets Monday nights from 6- 9pm in the upstairs 3000 sq. ft. studio of The Art Stop, located at 1822 Penfield Road, Penfield, NY 14526. Artists of all levels and abilities are welcome! The Studio can handle up to 30 artists with 12 work stations in the form of a drawing horse-style bench as well as adjustable easels and tables with chairs. Drawing boards and personal lighting for your use in the studio are provided or you are welcome to bring your own. Artists should bring their own paper and drawing medium or come early and purchase supplies at The Art Stop prior to a session. Currently we rotate thru 15 male and female models of all shapes and sizes to give variety to the artists to study and capture in artistic form. Poses start with quick gesture and then move on to short poses of 5-15 minutes and then longer poses of 20-35 minutes.

Cost: \$7/hr or \$6/hr Paid in Advance

Paid in advance punch cards are available: \$55 (which covers 3 full sessions) or \$90 (which covers 5 full sessions) Punch Cards can also be used on an hourly basis.
